Established by the I.V. Federated Women's Club, it opened in late spring 1959.

KUHS Dissolves Corporation

At a Special Meeting on November 21, 2008 the board voted unanimously to dissolve Kerby Union High School Alumni Association, Inc. as of July 31, 2009. The meeting was called by president Clint Freitas '44 for the purpose of winding up the business of the corporation. Board members present were: Clint, Otis and Carmelita Krauss Hussey '46, Jack '46 and Marcheta Campbell Owen '48, Jack Heald '44, Cleo Doney Arrants '44, Ernie Krauss '44. Donniss Sauer Smith '44, and Jay Hays '43. Also attending were Elodie Krauss and Norma Hays.

To facilitate the details of terminating the corporation's mission, Jack Heald gave a comprehensive report on work he has accomplished with various organizations regarding Rogue Valley Community College's possible use of the Kerby Park and the development of an "Honor Lorna Byrne Day." Discussion followed and Jack

was designated the KUHS Alumni spokesman for the Rogue Community College project to take whatever action could be done to preserve the park, and to promote "Honor Lorna Byrne Day."

The last meeting of KUHS Inc. will be held on Sunday, July 5th at 10 a.m. at Jubilee Park Pavilion at the annual alumni breakfast. Even tho the corporate entity will no longer exist, KUHS alumni will continue to hold reunions on the IVHS Alumni and Friends' annual alumni weekend nearest July 4th.

Daily, the Club provides a safe, supervised place for 80 youngsters from ages 6 to 18. We have room for more. They are encouraged by caring staff to set and achieve goals. Now, more than ever, we need help from you to continue to help them.

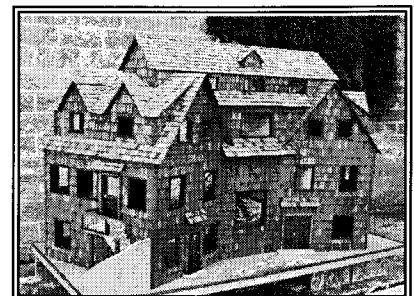

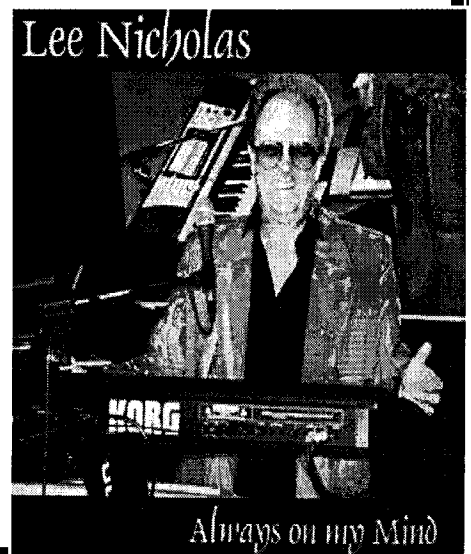

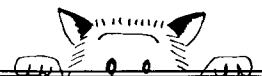
